The City of Renton Economic Development staff is available to provide information about permits, land use applications and other department requirements, including information related to the following:

- » Signs Most signs require sign permits; please check with staff to see if you will need a permit.
- **» Building Permits** Generally needed to construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move, change the occupancy or intensity of use of a building or structure or electrical, gas, mechanical or plumbing system.
- » Retail Food Establishment Permit This license is required and issued by King County for all facilities selling, serving and preparing food.
- **» Liquor License** This license is required and issued by State of Washington Liquor and Cannabis Board.
- » Special Event Permit This license allows businesses and organizations to host a public event, and is issued by the City of Renton.
- **» Home Business** The rules governing a home business can be found in the City's Municipal Code, please review the code before applying for a business license.
- **» City Utility** The City of Renton Utility Billing division provides customer service, billing and revenue collections for water, sewer, surface water, and a pass through charge for King County Sewer Treatment.
- » Pre-Lease Program The Pre-Lease program is a resource for business owners who want to lease or buy commercial space, property owners wanting to renovate/redevelop commercial space locating in the City of Renton. Staff from relevant city departments will meet with you in the new space, conduct a walk through, and provide comments and answer questions.




